Tonight while watching the first snow of the season continue to fall, I checked the tv listings and discovered two movies that piqued my interest: Santa Claus The Movie and the 1973 made-for-television version of Miracle on 34th Street. Since I have seen Santa Claus (the rather disappointing movie made by Alexander Salkind, producer of the Christopher Reeve Superman films), I decided to check out one of at least 2 remakes of the 1947 classic. It is a virtual who's who of 1970s television stars. Sabastian Cabot (Mr. French from Family Affair), Tom Bosley (Mr. C from Happy Days), David Hartman (whom I remember as the co-host of Good Morning America back in the day... can't say much for his acting ability), Jim Backus (Thurston Howell III and Mr. Magoo, himself), <u>Roddy McDowell</u>, and David Doyle (Bosley from the Charlie's Angels tv series) were just a few of the actors that made the whole thing seem like a bad Love Boat/Fantasy Island I think the best thing about watching remakes is the episode. fun in which one can have discussing the merits of the different versions. I must correct myself; there are actually a total of 4 remakes. Three television versions (1955, 1959, and 1973) as well as the 1994 theatrical version.

One tidbit I learned from <u>imdb.com</u>, Mr. Cabot had to shave the trademark beard from his role on Family Affair and wear an "official" Kris Kringle beard.
